## *St Mary's Church, Broughton*

*It may be helpful for you to have a little information about the church. It was built from locally available flint and chalk. The oldest parts date from the twelfth century, and there was gradual growth over the succeeding years. There was a serious fire in the seventeenth century, as you can still see from the condition of some of the pillars. There is a pervading sense of light and peace throughout the building. For many generations it has been the spiritual heart of the community, and it still is.*
