10. That the Committee be appointed in turn as they stand on the books, and shall serve twelve months.

11. That the Secretary shall remit all money taken to the Post Office Savings Bank, Broughton.

12. That no money be drawn from the bank without the signature of the Secretary and the Trustees for any purpose.

13. That any member not wishing to stand on the Committee can retire by the payment of sixpence, and the next man to stand in his place, the money to go to the fund.

## RULES.

1. That this Society be called "The Broughton Pig Insurance Society" against loss by premature death of pigs belonging to tradesmen and working men of Broughton. That any person wishing to become a member of this Society can do so by the payment of sixpence, to be entitled to benefit at the expiration of three months. All subscriptions to be paid in advance.
2. That each member shall insure his pigs by the following payment—that is, to pay for each pig sixpence and twopence per month as a subscription.
3. That each member shall pay his subscription regularly on the first Monday in January, April, July, and October. If not paid at the quarter to be fined sixpence, and if not at six months to cease to be a member, and the money to go to the fund.
4. That any member sustaining loss by premature death of pig shall give notice to the Secretary, who shall give notice to the Committee, who shall value the same and obtain an order from the Secretary for the amount, which shall be handed over to the sufferer, except in cases hereinafter mentioned.
5. That there shall be a Committee, which shall consist of seven persons, and the Secretary to be always one of the Committee.
6. That any member having a pig ill shall give notice to the Secretary, who shall give notice to the Committee, who shall be required to see it, and endeavour to ascertain if the illness has been brought on by any neglect on the part of the owner, and if so, in case of death, a report of the same shall be laid before the Committee, and if they cannot agree satisfactorily the case shall be laid before the whole Society, and such an award made as shall be decided upon by the Society; such award, not being less than one half the value of the pig, shall be final and conclusive.
7. That any member having a valuable pig ill not likely to live, the Committee are empowered to have the same killed, and if it is not safe to let the pig live any longer it shall be killed, valued, or sold for what it is worth, and the remainder made up to the owner by the Society. If it sold at market price nothing shall be allowed from the Society. The Committee must, and shall be allowed, to see the pig alive or dead.
8. That there shall be an annual meeting of this Society, to be held the first Monday in April at 7.30 o'clock in the evening, at which time a report of the Society's progress shall be laid before the whole Society.
9. That books and other expenses incurred by the Society shall be paid for out of its funds, but its working shall be carried on at the least possible expense. That the time of meeting
